West End took the lead when striker Josh Hamer buried his effort past keeper Scott Reid through a crowded area. Osian Wyn got the final touch past Reid for an own goal for the third.

Tom Harris drilled in a fourth and to make matters worse Vincent Atueyi received a straight red card for mouthing off to the refer-

ee. Then just before the final whistle substitute Jordan Richards was carried off with a knee injury.
